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NETFLIX AND CHILL COMES TO ASPENDALE GARDENS

High speed internet has arrived in Aspendale Gardens, thanks to an initiative from Uniti Wireless and AGRA.

Internet access has traditionally been a problem for Aspendale Gardens homes. Long term residents will remember that Aspendale Gardens was the last suburb in Victoria to receive ADSL, with slow speeds well below modern standards.

Following discussions with AGRA, Uniti Wireless have set up high speed internet into Aspendale Gardens via access points on Aspendale Gardens Shopping Centre and Braeside. Download speeds have been measured at up to 50 Mbps, or ten times faster than current access. This is equivalent to NBN speeds, without requiring cable access.

Not all households are covered in the first stage of rollout. Initial coverage includes western and central Aspendale Gardens.

To expand the service further, City of Kingston councillors met to expand access in Aspendale Gardens via access points on council buildings. "We want to get high speed internet to all of our community as soon as possible" said **Cr Geoff Gledhill**. "This is a breakthrough for our residents, and we need to make sure no-one in Aspendale Gardens is left behind" said **Cr Tamsin Bearsley**.

Uniti Wireless reports more antennas are planned. AGRA have heard rumours that Uniti speeds may double to 100 Mbps in the near future with upgrades.

Feedback from residents in the coverage zone have been overwhelmingly positive, with the following comments from the AGRA Facebook page.

"We signed up first change we had and have never looked back. Fast and reliable, Great start Uniti" said resident **Kevin** Wilson.

"No more World Wide Wait; NBN speeds NOW, not in 'maybe' 2-3 years, rock solid stability, even during downpours, and very generous data allowance. WIN WIN" said resident **Lindsay Vincent**

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Long-awaited Mordialloc Bypass gets the green light!

The Victorian Budget 2017/18 will include \$300 million to build the 9 kilometre road between Springvale Road in Aspendale Gardens and the Dingley Bypass to slash congestion and improve safety in one of Melbourne's fastest growing areas.

"I am so proud that the Andrews Labor Government is building this vital and necessary road, to support local jobs and get you to work and home sooner and safer," said Member for Mordialloc, **Tim Richardson**.

Over coming months, local residents, business owners and road users will be asked for input on concept designs, which will be considered as part of the planning process.

ATM THIEVES BUNGLE HEIST

The ANZ ATM Machine was again attacked in May with thieves attempting a 3am heist armed with hi-viz vests and angle grinders. They were disturbed after police within two minutes. They fled empty handed after ramming the police car. Centre management have confirmed the ATM will be replaced inside the centre so only available during centre hours.





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In a shocking slap outcome for the Aspendale Gardens community alongside Ritchies IGA and shopping centre traders, VCAT have approved 82 apartments to be developed above the Aspendale Gardens shopping Centre.

The VCAT decision overturns an earlier Kingston Council ruling, which rejected an extension to development above the Aspendale Gardens Shopping Centre.

After a public meeting organised by AGRA, City of Kingston received over 400 objections to the overdevelopment.

Ken Carney represented AGRA at the week-long session at VCAT in February.

AGRA was joined by **Jono Whelan** from the Aspendale
Gardens Community Centre,
representatives of IGA and
the ground floor owners
corporation, and City of
Kingston, all facing off
against the upstairs
developers.

Both Ken and Jono were unpaid, and took and entire week out to represent us. We received feedback that they both did an amazing job. We thank Ken and Jono for supporting our community.

VCAT APPROVES "CAR STACKERS" FOR APARTMENTS ABOVE SHOPPING CENTRE

Regardless of the opposition by AGRA, Kingston Council, IGA, the AG community centre, and 400 objectors, VCAT still ruled in favour of the developer.

In a controversial move, making the situation even worse, VCAT endorsed a solution that included car stackers and car parks that fail to meet the Australian standard for car park dimensions.

"This is totally the wrong direction for a state government body like VCAT" said **Cr Tamsin Bearsley.** "Council rejected the developer application with five pages of reasons. If VCAT overrides our decisions, as citizens we need to re-assess the mandate of VCAT".

The case presented by AGRA included neighbourhood character, car parking, waste management, services on balcony areas, traffic, internal amenity and impact on the shopping centre.

AGRA's case was backed by expert townplanning guidance from **Lauren Richardson**. We thank Lauren for her support.

Residents report that the car park is already full at school drop-off and pickup. VCAT dismissed parent concerns that extra pressure from apartments will make this worse.

"Who in their right mind would use car stackers when there's a whole outside car park available?" said resident **Lucinda Bertram**.

According to the VCAT order, construction must begin before 6th April 2018.

Before construction, the developer must first get agreement from the downstairs owners on a range of conditions.

Discussions with downstairs owners indicate that agreement between upstairs and downstairs on construction details is not likely to be forthcoming in the near future.

How will this affect downstairs tenants? That's the question no-one has an answer to yet.

Watch this space...

All is not lost.

The upstairs developers have an almost impossible task of requiring downstairs agreement to proceed. It may yet prove all too difficult for the developers.
