COMMUNITY RESPONDS TO WOOLWORTHS DEVELOPMENT

A developer application for a Woolworths and speciality shops to replace the Mitre 10 and Dan Murphys in nearby Chelsea Heights is headed for VCAT to be heard on 23 to 27 November.

AGRA is opposing the Development along with the City of Kingston and Ritchies IGA.

AGRA has taken this stance in response to the majority of the community's concern over its impact on the local Aspendale Gardens Shopping Centre and the loss of the hardware store.

Economic reports state that the new development could cause a sales impact of almost 30% on Aspendale Gardens Shopping Centre, threatening it's viability.


Many residents surveyed also raised concern with the monopoly of easily accessible Woolworths already in the area - Mordialloc, Keysborough, Chelsea, Patterson Lakes, Mentone Thrift Park, Parkmore and Springvale.

Kirk Devers from the Waterways Owners Corporation was surprised to learn of the development. "It's a gambling & entertainment precinct and to combine this with a supermarket contravenes gambling & planning laws. The City of Kingston was right to reject the proposal and now Woolworths think they are above the law? This is yet another example of Woolworth's greed and bullying tactics and they are the ones challenging this decision, focused on profits and not our community."

Residents have commented that the heart of Aspendale Gardens community should be valued and supported.

Andrew Priestley, candidate for Sandpiper Ward City of Kingston, said "Ritchies IGA have supported and invested in our suburb when no other supermarket was willing to take a risk on our small community. They have continually given back and worked with residents".

AGRA also acknowledges members of our community who are in favour of the development, and those who would like to see improvements made to the current AG Shopping Centre. We have passed all feedback and comments of the survey to IGA and Shopping Centre Management.


I've lived in Aspendale Gardens nearly 15 years now and love the parks and gardens that surround our homes.


We are truly blessed to live in such a beautiful part of the world.

CELEBRATING 20 YEARS IN ASPENDALE GARDENS

Ritchies IGA is celebrating 20 years in the Aspendale Gardens Shopping Centre after opening its doors in July 2000.

In that time the locals have been very active users of the Community Benefit Card that allows them to donate a percentage of their shopping to their favourite charity or community group.

Ritchies CEO Fred Harrison said: "To date the CBC has donated more than \$750,000++ to the local community plus additional donations to the Royal Children's Hospital and major state-wide charities including the CFA and Salvation Army".



He said the Aspendale Gardens community was one of the strongest in the Ritchies network and total donations would probably be close to \$1 million overall. Shoppers come from Chelsea, Chelsea Heights, Edithvale, Aspendale and Aspendale Gardens.

"We have thousands of card holders who are very community minded!" Mr Harrison said.

He also thanked shoppers who have been very supportive of staff during the COVID-19 lockdown.

Mr Harrison said a new Ritchies Card and app was being launched 14 October that would make it even easier to donate to the community. "The app and card will provide members with weekly Ritchies specials including extra savings and exclusive special offers," he said. This will replace the Community Benefit Card.

"We welcome the entire community to sign up for the new card and app to enjoy the additional benefits," Mr Harrison said.

Ritchies is one of Australia's oldest supermarket groups and is celebrating its 150th anniversary.
