



### **MORDIALLOC BYPASS BUDGETED** PROGRESS ON LONG-AWAITED ROAD WELCOMED BY RESIDENTS AND COMMUNITY GROUPS

Residents continue to report that the amount of traffic on Wells Rd and Governor Rd is 'beyond a joke'. When Wells Rd turns into a car park at peak hours, it divides Aspendale Gardens.

The Mordialloc Bypass project is moving along, with VicRoads recently attending the Aspendale Gardens Shopping Centre to listen to the community and provide an update on the project.

The road reservation has been in place since 1967, with the current State Government including \$300M in the 2017/2018 budget for the construction of the bypass.

The next step is the Environmental Effects Survey (EES) to investigate the

impact the Bypass could have on man-made wetlands, Braeside Park and surrounding communities. The EES is targeted for completion by mid 2018, with Bypass completion in 2021.

The Bypass will follow the road reservation on the western border of Braeside Park. Braeside Park will remain protected as the beautiful oasis that residents know and love.

AGRA has campaigned for the traffic project for more than 20 years based on community-identified needs. Other community organisations have voiced support for the project, including Frankston Business Network, Seaford Community Committee and the Carrum and Patterson Lakes Forum. The AGRA team are hoping to see more grade separations rather than traffic lights at intersections, however we don't want to wait even longer for the 'perfect' road.

The majority of community sentiment about the Bypass can be summarised as 'just get it done'.

Not everyone is happy, however. Residents living near the road reserve who believed "the bypass was never actually going to be built" have expressed understandable disappointment. In this edition we look into opposition claims and offer our analysis.



# SCHOOL BUS ROUTE TROUBLE AHEAD

Aspendale Gardens students travelling to Parkdale Secondary College will face a more difficult journey to school if Transport Victoria have their way. It's looking like splitsville for school bus route 708.

Transport Victoria, a State Government body, have released plans to split the existing bus route 708 into two separate parts, terminating at Mordialloc Station. Students will be forced to change at Mordialloc for a second bus if they wish to continue onto Parkdale Secondary College.

Transport Victoria provided a website for public feedback during consultation. Residents reported that the website was "broken" and even on the final day of consultation was not receiving feedback.

"No sitting, squashed like sardines! That's only if the bus stops" **Michaelene WJ** 


"We definitely need another bus for the Parkdale Secondary kids to Chelsea Heights! Currently they have one designated school bus that is dangerously overcrowded.

My daughter has been jammed in the doorway, stood on, had her arm cut by being squashed up against the door, uniforms are being ripped because of overcrowding, that's if they're lucky to even get on it. If they miss that bus they walk a few blocks and wait for the public bus which on occasion has driven past students and left them to wait for another bus as they are full" **Kym Allsep** 

AGRA reached out to Labor MP Tim Richardson and Liberal candidate Geoff Gledhill for comment.

**Geoff Gledhill**: "PTV have an obligation to provide students with the most direct and safest journey to school. I can't see any justification for PTV placing timetabling above student wellbeing and safety. Furthermore it has been clear for some time that extra direct services Parkdale SEC are required given the current level of overcrowding, again, a safety issue for students!"

**Tim Richardson MP** reported on Facebook about PTV's feedback website failing, saying "I have personally noted your feedback and shared this with the Minister's office". He also reported to AGRA that he has asked the Transport Minister not to split the bus route until Mentone.



# NBN - COMING SOON...



### Aspendale Gardens addresses are likely to see the local NBN roll-out commence in June 2018.

Following the changes to the NBN rollout in November 2014, Aspendale Gardens was to be connected using two different technologies; those who currently have access to the Optus cable network (HFC) were to be connected using this network and those who didn't were to be connected using fibre to the node (FTTN) instead.

In September 2016 it was decided that the Optus HFC network was not fit for purpose and instead these areas would be connected using fibre to the distribution point (FTTC) instead.

This new technology brings fibre closer to the house than FTTN but still relies on the final connection to the home being made using copper.

Finally in April 2017 the scale of the FTTC rollout was expanded following the high number of complaints relating to the FTTN rollout and now all premises in Aspendale Gardens are due to have this technology type made available.

We will run a community information night so that anyone who is unsure of what they have to do and when they have to do it can come along and ask questions. Check our Facebook page for updates.

# LOOKING INTO MORDIALLOC BYPASS OPPONENT CLAIMS



*Every major infrastructure project has supporters and opponents.* 

AGRA have looked into claims opposing the project and we offer our analysis here.

### Claim: The Mordialloc Bypass was never actually going to be built.

Conclusion: False.

Analysis: The road reservation has existed since 1967. Both Liberal and Labor state governments have recognised need for the project. It was never a case of "if", but "when".

#### Claim: Mordialloc Bypass will go through the middle of Braeside Park.

Conclusion: False.

Analysis: The planned bypass travels along the western border of Braeside Park.

### Claim: The road ultimately leads to nowhere.

Conclusion: False.

Analysis: The road clearly joins Dingley Bypass to the Mordialloc Peninsula Freeway on all plans. Claim: wetlands are home to the Australasian Bittern, and endangered species.

Conclusion: Plausible, but limited.

Analysis: The human-made Waterways wetlands are not the only possible home for the bittern, and not all of the Waterways wetlands will be changed nor removed by construction of the bypass.

Mention is made of the Australasian Bittern in a case study about Waterways winning an award for the restoration project.

Sightings of the Bittern are recorded in nearby areas including: Braeside Park, Woodlands Industrial Estate, Edithvale Wetlands. No sightings listed for Mordialloc Wetland or Waterways.

The impact on the Bitterns' available habitat is likely to be limited. Regardless, it is fair that the Environmental Effects Survey (EES) takes this into account.

### Claim: The planned road goes through an old asbestos tip.

Conclusion: Plausible, but without evidence.

Analysis: The claim is preying on fear by imagining danger and catastrophe. Many rubbish dump sites exist in the City of Kingston. If the claim is true, then VicRoads requires a plan for managing it. We don't accept the assumption that there is no way to manage safety. Claim: The road just shifts traffic problems. Suburbs will be divided and disrupted.

Conclusion: False.

Analysis: While there will be temporary disruption during construction, Aspendale Gardens, long divided by Wells Rd, will become a more socially cohesive suburb once traffic is diverted away up the bypass. A look at the map clearly shows that the Waterways housing estate is not divided into two.

What the protest literature ignores is that the traffic from the Frankston Freeway already goes along Wells Rd, Governor Rd, Boundary Rd, White St and Springvale Rd, much of it already ending up at Warrigal Rd and South Rd.

The existing traffic causes unnecessary congestion and noise in residential White St which is already over capacity. It creates danger for drivers and pedestrians on residential Wells Rd and White St. Both are roads that children cross on their way to school. The Mordialloc bypass will reduce traffic, reduce noise and improve safety in these residential areas.

We agree that a proper freeway with flyovers is the way to get maximum benefit. This is a good argument to build the bypass to freeway standard from the beginning.
